- Work independently to design technical solutions for the construction, movement, and function of scenic elements.
- Take an active role in the general safety of all DDP Scene Shop operations and overseeing compliance with safety regulations.
- In conjunction with the DDP Technical Director: maintain tools and equipment, manufacturing spaces, and office.
- Assist in loading and unloading scenery and trucking scenery to and from theatrical spaces.
