SYNOPSIS:

This family-friendly 1977 Tony Award-winner for Best Musical is based on Harold Gray's popular comic strip "Little Orphan Annie". Little orphan Annie is taken from her orphanage, and the clutches of evil Miss Hannigan, to stay at billionaire Oliver Warbucks' mansion for the holidays. When Annie wins the hearts of Warbucks and his staff, they set out on an epic mission to find Annie's parents. Meanwhile, Miss Hannigan, in partnership with her brother Rooster and his girlfriend Lily, attempt to make some money out of this unique situation. The stories become intertwined as the lovable Annie's story hits the national spotlight.

AGES:

The movie rating for the 1982 film was PG. We recommend this show for all ages though the length may be long for very young children. However, parents are encouraged to use their own judgement and discretion when choosing shows for children based on their maturity and interest level.

DETAILS:

Like in the classic film version, Ms. Hannigan is a heavy drinker and not kind to the orphans. Ms. Hannigan says "damn" and "Oh God". Warbucks says, "hell", and uses "damn" a dozen times. The dog catcher mentions "putting a dog to sleep". There are threats of violence to the orphans, but no one is ever hurt.
