SYNOPSIS:

Come From Away chronicles the real-life experiences of the people of Gander, Newfoundland, and the almost 7,000 airline passengers who were forced to land there when US air space was closed on September 11, 2001. Twelve actors tell the story of both the Islanders and the Plane People, revealing the fear and uncertainty that came with the terrorist attacks – as well as the profound generosity and compassion of strangers. An exciting new Broadway musical!

AGES:

We recommend this show for ages 13 and up. However, parents are encouraged to use their own judgement and discretion when choosing shows for children based on their maturity and interest level.

DETAILS:

By today's standards, this show would probably be rated PG-13, with the main concern being the sensitive and heavy topic of September 11. Although the events aren't actually shown or discussed in detail, it is repeatedly referenced and alluded to. Some viewers may be triggered. There are some scenes that depict racism and discrimination. There are a few scenes with alcohol consumption and some brief tender moments between characters, including a gay couple. One man describes a humiliating strip search. There is some mild swearing (for a complete list, please ask the box office).

LENGTH:

Approximately 2 ½ hours with an intermission.
