



## **SHOW CONTENT INFORMATION SHEET**

**SYNOPSIS:** In a Gotham-like city, a terrible water shortage, caused by a 20-year drought, has led to a government-enforced ban on private toilets. The citizens must use public amenities, regulated by a single malevolent company that profits by charging admission for one of humanity's most basic needs. Perhaps this is merely a ruse to keep the poor poor, a convenient grift for the moneyed town officials. Amid the people, a hero decides that he's had enough and plans a revolution to lead them all to freedom! This musical is satiric, offering a comic take on environmental issues, politics and capitalism, and parodies *The Cradle Will Rock*, *The Threepenny Opera*, as well as the Broadway musical art form.

**AGES:** We recommend this show for ages 10 and up. However, parents are encouraged to use their own judgement and discretion when choosing shows for children based on their maturity and interest level.

**DETAILS:** There is a little adult language and sexual innuendo. There is some brief cartoonish violence and talk of torture, but inevitably the evil are punished. There is plenty of bathroom humor wordplay, but nothing risqué. The cleverness of the jokes and lyrics appeal to adults without offending young children.

**LENGTH:** Approximately 2 ½ hours with an intermission.
